THE PARTY OF THE PARTY.

This observatory offers a canoramic view over the town's main attractions: Mejima Island, Mt. Iwado, Mt. Alago, Mt. Fuji and the Hayasaki Peninsula. It also allows you Kuchinotsu Port Terminal Building to observe the process of volcanic eruptions that occurred at the southern tip of the Shimabara Peninsula from around 4.3 million to 1.5 million years ago.
